ADS Recognized Shows Hold Steady

The question on every show organizer, competitor, and driving industry vendor's mind is "How are we doing in these uncertain economic times?" Well, here is what the numbers tell us.

In 2007 there were 82 recognized shows. Three of the shows were cancelled due to lack of entries. Two were first time pleasure driving shows that just didn't spark enough entries to get off the ground.

In contrast 2008, there were 89 recognized shows. Six shows cancelled; three because of competition site problems, two for lack of entries and one for financial reasons. Of these 89 shows, ten were competitions newly recognized by the ADS, Four HDT's, three CDE's and three pleasure driving shows. The new shows are located primarily on the coasts with California being the most popular site.

The 2009 January to June show seasons looks very much the same with 38 shows sending in applications for the Omnibus at the time of this writing, four of which are new and the office has had conversations with three interested organizers, inquiring about hosting an ADS recognized event in their area in the near future. These tentative shows are located primarily in the Midwest.

We have more paid memberships this year, 2,888 up from 2,729. Since October 1 we have gained 331 new members, in November of 2007 we had gained 388. However in 2006 we had 534 members that did not renew. This year we have dropped that number down to 429.

What do all these numbers mean about the health of the society? Our show numbers are up but so were the cancellations. Membership is up but do to member retention then to new memberships. It's difficult to determine if we are truly growing or still remaining steady.

2009 will be a very telling year for the society. Members are going to be watching their bottom lines closely and taking a hard look at their discretionary spending. The ADS Board of Directors will be doing the same when they review the 2009 budget. Changes are inevitable.

Course Designer's Clinic

Some of the largest expense items for events are the travel costs for officials. The short answer is to use local officials whenever possible. Guess what? We don't have many Judges or Technical Delegates (Pleasure, Dressage or Combined Driving) in our four club area. Like driving horses, officials take time and schooling to grow. "Learner" officials have to pay their own costs to attend clinics and events. It's a fairly high cost for a couple of years before a Learner can apply for their 'r' rating - the level that most of us use for our events.

Georgia Carriage Driving Association (GCDA) is proposing an alliance between our four clubs to address this problem. All four clubs are within a 4-hour drive of each other and our members compete in each other's events. Many of us are members of all four clubs. It makes sense for us to combine efforts to provide a relatively low cost approach to training the officials - both licensed and not - we all need.

GCDA will begin this training alliance with a Combined Driving Course Design clinic with Margie Margentino, USEF and FEI licensed Course Designer, at Tom & Charlene Hilgenberg's Great Oak Farm in Newnan, Georgia on 12-14 December, 2008. Friday and Saturday are dedicated to Course Design with Sunday providing an opportunity to "drive the Great Oaks hazards with Margie". Cost is \$100 per person and the clinic is limited to 12 participants. In order to keep this inexpensive, GCDA will provide lunch on Friday and Saturday. We ask that you discuss this idea and this clinic in particular with your club, identify members that want to attend and let us know your wishes by the end of September. We will open the clinic to all through the ADS website and the CD-L in October. We would also like exchange thoughts on a training alliance for the mid-south with your club.

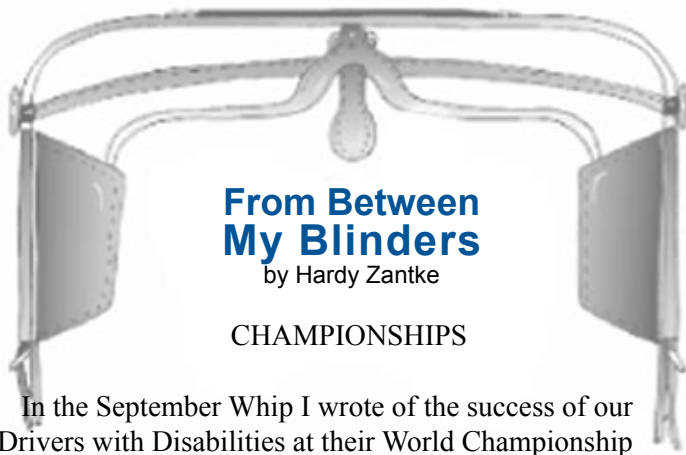

From Between My Blinders

CHAMPIONSHIPS

In the September Whip I wrote of the success of our Drivers with Disabilities at their World Championship in Germany in July. In the meantime also our other international drivers have returned home from their World Championships in Europe and our Pony drivers as well as Horse Pair drivers had their National Championships at The Laurels.

Our four single drivers, Robin Groves, Bill Peacock, Donna Crookston and Leslie Berndt had a good go at the Singles World Driving Championship in Jarantow, Poland. They were not able to bring home any medals, but they all gave it their best and finished without any mishaps. They all were first timers on that side of the pond and at such a high pressure and prestigious event. Our team finished in 11th place out of 17 countries, Robin was 25th, Leslie 27th, Bill 36th, and Donna 50th in a field of 66 competitors.

Our Four-in-Hand drivers - after their success in Aachen went on to a great show at Riesenbeck at the 50th German Fahrderby (which was started in 1950 - long before Prince Philip had developed the international FEI driving rules) which was won by Chester Weber based on an outstanding dressage win with 32.90 penalty points - considered to be a low point record of FEI Dressage Test No 8a. Tucker Johnson finished with a great third place. They went on to a similar success at their World Championship at Beesd in Holland, where Chester was able to beat his own previous dressage record to a low 32.13 penalty points giving him a clear win in dressage and combined with a great marathon and good cones round was able to capture the Silver Medal with Tucker finishing 16th in a field of 58 while their team member James Fairclough unfortunately was eliminated on the marathon, but he had won Presentation. The Team finished 5th out of 16 countries.

At the Laurels our new National Single Pony Champion became Suzy Stafford, ahead of Miranda Cadwell, Sara Schmitt, Sterling Graburn and six more contenders, while Lisa Singer once again won the title of National Pair Champion - now for the 8th time, over Keady Cadwell, Alan Aulson and Larry Poulin who had a mishap on the marathon. Tracey Morgan was the only advanced pony pair entry, and Lisa Stroud won over Elizabeth Keathley in the pony four-in-hands.

I trust that you'll find more detailed reports about all

these Championships probably in the December Whip.

There was one more new international competition which I think is worth mentioning, even though no American driver was competing there (yet?): 93 drivers from 12 countries competed at the Junior World Trophy in Stadl Paura, Austria this July. It was won by the team from Belgium over Austria (South), and England, followed by HUN, FRA, GER, AUT (North), SUI, DEN and Wales. ESP, ITA and NED sent individual drivers. This event is not (yet?) sanctioned by the FEI, thus does not have the title World Championship, and while there was originally some controversy around it and if National Federations could support it, it seems that now all major European driving countries were represented there with their young drivers, starting with 7/8 year old children driving ponies under 120 cm (11-3 hands) up to 17/18 year old juniors with ponies up to 148 cm - all a bit similar to our ADT rules, e.g. without a cross country marathon. I hear the next one is planned for 2010 in Turin, Italy and then in 2012 in Hungary. Perhaps we'll be able to participate some day with our young drivers there too?

Speaking of our young drivers: Please remind them of our own ADS Youth Championship! The deadline to send in their paperwork is by the end of next Month (November 30th). I hope many will participate. All details were in the March Whip - and are also on the ADS website under Young Drivers - Championships. As prizes the ADS Fund has promised a Grant of up to \$ 750,- for each winner to attend an ADS Youth Camp next year. In addition, each winner should get a winner's sports jacket and of course his name and hopefully a picture should be featured in the March Whip. So - YOUNG DRIVERS - please do get your entries ready for the last Championship this year.

Competition Schedule Set for 2010 Alltech FEI World Equestrian Games

LEXINGTON, KY—Sixteen days of eight world championships are officially scheduled for the 2010 Alltech FEI World Equestrian Games. The competition schedule was released today by the World Games 2010 Foundation.

A detailed competition schedule is now available online. “This schedule is certain to provide an exciting variety of top sport on each of the 16 days of the Games,” said Competition Director Kate Jackson. “Spectators will find events of interest every day and will be entertained by the beauty and spectacle that is inherent to equestrian competition at this level.” “I am particularly happy that we are able, for the first time, to include Para-Equestrian as an integral part of the World Equestrian Games. We are pleased and honored to do so,” Jackson said.

The Games will begin with opening ceremonies on September 25, 2010. The first weekend of competition will include Vaulting and Endurance.

The schedule may still experience minor changes, but no

major shifts to the individual discipline schedules are expected.

The Alltech FEI World Equestrian Games, to be held at the Kentucky Horse Park, are the world championships of the eight equestrian disciplines recognized by the Fédération Equestre Internationale (FEI), and are held every four years. The Games have never been held outside of Europe; nor have all eight disciplines competed at a single site—both firsts that will be achieved at the Kentucky Horse Park.

The Games will be broadcast on NBC Sports, which has made the largest network commitment to coverage of equestrian sport in U.S. television history. The 2010 Games are expected to have a statewide economic impact of \$150 million, and current sponsors include the Rolex Company and an unprecedented \$10 million title sponsor, Alltech. It is anticipated that more than 600,000 tickets will be sold for the 16-day competition.

2010 Alltech FEI World Equestrian Games Tickets on Sale in One Year

LEXINGTON, KY—Tickets for the 2010 Alltech FEI World Equestrian Games will go on sale one year as of **September 25, 2009**. The announcement of ticket sales comes at the “Halfway There” Celebration with two years to go until the Games.

“We are excited to announce the much-anticipated on-sale date for tickets to the 2010 Alltech FEI World Equestrian Games,” said Ruth Mason, Director of Ticketing. “With a high demand for tickets, we have created a ticket program that will be accessible and affordable for interested buyers.”

Approximately 600,000 tickets will be available for the 2010 Alltech FEI World Equestrian Games. Tickets will be priced as low as \$25. In addition, General Admission tickets will be available, providing access to the Kentucky Horse Park for the day, where visitors can experience various equine demonstrations and browse the extensive trade show.

Ticket sales will be facilitated by the 2010 Games Ticketing Provider, Ticketmaster, Inc. All ticket sales will be completed online at Ticketmaster.com. Final ticket prices will be determined by early 2009.

“The 2010 Alltech FEI World Equestrian Games is a global event and demand for tickets will span beyond Kentucky and around the world,” said John Long CEO of the United States Equestrian Federation.
